DEFINITIONS

- The International Organisation for Standardisation defines;
- Telehealth as the 'use of telecommunication techniques for the purpose of providing telemedicine, medical education, and health education over a distance',
- 2. telemedicine, is defined as the 'use of advanced telecommunication technologies to exchange health information and provide health care services across geographic, time, social and cultural barriers'.

- Store & Forward
- Live
- Hybrid

MEDICARE-FUNDED TELEHEALTH SERVICES

- From 1 July 2011, Medicare and DVA Rebates and Financial Incentives will be available for telehealth
- People in telehealth eligible areas of Australia have access to specialist video consultations (live telemedicine) under Medicare
- This provides many patients with easier access to specialists, without the time and expense involved in travelling to major cities.

SPECIALIST SERVICES MBS VIDEO CONSULTATION ITEMS

- 11 MBS items provide for video consultations in telehealth eligible areas across a range of specialities; On 1 January 2013, 6 new MBS items took effect
- These new items will have the same requirements for patients as other telehealth items that is: not an admitted patient; and
- 1. not a patient of an emergency department; and
- 2. located in a telehealth eligible area at the time of the attendance; and
- 3. located at least 15km by road from the specialist; or
- 4. a care recipient of a residential aged care facility (located anywhere in Australia); or
- 5. a patient of an eligible Aboriginal Medical Service (located anywhere in Australia)





TELEHEALTH ELIGIBLE AREAS


- Telehealth eligibility is determined according to the Australian Standard Geographical Classification Remoteness Area (ASGC-RA) classifications.
- Medicare Benefit Schedule (MBS) benefits will now only be available for services provided to patients outside of RA1 – Major Cities.
- This change does not affect residents of Aged Care Facilities or patients of eligible Aboriginal Medical Services or eligible Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Services who are exempt from the geographical requirements



National - Telehealth Eligible Areas Australian Standards Geographic Classification (ASGC) RA. Telehealth Eligible Areas are outside RA 1.




Australian Capital Territory -Telehealth Eligible Areas are outside RA 1.








Victoria- Telehealth Eligible Areas are outside RA 1.
